Eight-lesson summary chart

Lesson	Focus	Mission card	One-sentence Purpose
1	Launch & Website Exploration	Mission: Explore to Restore	Students are introduced to the mission, explore the LPRC for Kids website, and engage with the content in a self-directed, curiosity-driven way.
2	Scientists at Work	Scientists at Work	Students watch WWF scientist videos Q&A to understand how population data is collected, why it matters, and how youth can contribute.
3	Species Stories & Biodiversity	Wildlife Investigation	Students explore biodiversity through species stories and quizzes, identifying connections between species, habitats, and ecosystems.
4	Ecosystem Game	All Species are Connected	Students experience how changes to one species ripple through an ecosystem, deepening understanding of interdependence.
5	Species Stories - Extended Mapping	Map the Connections	Students deepen understanding of biodiversity through extended mapping, connecting species' roles, habitats, and interdependencies.
6	Student Scientists at Work	Student Scientists at Work	Students learn how to do wildlife observation and data collection to see how evidence informs actions that protect species and ecosystems. Start Citizen Science project.
7	Make a Pledge & Take Action	Explore to Restore Pledge	Students identify realistic actions for wildlife and make a personal or collective pledge, emphasizing collective impact.
8	Letter Writing	Think for Wildlife, Write for Change	Students reflect on all that they have learned about how to help wildlife, and write a letter to: family, school, community, or WWF-Canada
